From Becca

Over the last three months many have asked if I've been counting down the days until the sabbatical season came to a close. I always had a little hesitancy when answering this, for a few reasons. 1. I wasn't actually always keeping track, (at least not until the last two weeks). 2. I didn't want to rush this time. It's been holy and sacred in so many ways. 3. I didn't want to feel like I was rushing Lori's time to rejuvenate. Three months both seems like a long time and not long enough.

And now here we are: just as I feel like I've finally settled into a rhythm and gotten used to Lori being away, she's back! It's amazing how quickly this time passed. There were times in the middle that felt a little slower, but in general, I truly can't believe three months have passed. This time has been so intimate and holy, and that is because of all of you. I believe that taking this time to share our stories with one another has created a closeness. A closeness that perhaps we didn't fully realize we needed, but a closeness for which I think we are all grateful. As one of our storytellers named, they didn't necessarily know or identify with everyone else in the congregation, but hearing the stories and hearing similar themes of life, love, loss, and brokenness helped them (and I think the rest of us) realize that there is a lot that connects us to each other.

Even though in many ways we are all quite different from each other, seeing ourselves in each other has brought us closer together. If I could put a name to this season, I would call it grace. It feels like we have given each other more and more grace to simply be, to make mistakes, to learn and to grow. The Spirit has nourished us in ways that we needed and didn't quite know how to ask for.

We're poised, closely knit and roots growing ever deeper, to be the thriving congregation of St. Peter's. We're poised for challenging conversations and deeper listening. Alongside our storytelling, we held four Focus Groups where nearly 50 people shared in conversation about St. Peter's. (see page 5 for more details). And now we are preparing for more and continued conversation as a congregation. (see page 5).

I am hopeful for what lies ahead for this congregation. It is clear that the Spirit is moving among us, and we are listening and ready to respond.

I also want to say a deep and heart-felt thank you to all of you. While these three months have flown by, they have been full, exhausting, life-giving, and ministry affirming. I'm blessed and grateful to serve you. You have made these three months wonderful and I can't wait to see what lies ahead.

From Sam

I've started to write this several times and stopped because I don't like thinking about not being with you all anymore but, as they say, all good things must come to an end. Two and a half years have moved along quickly. I leave full of gratitude at the welcome you've given Molly, Spencer, and me during my time at St. Peter's. I leave equipped to be a better pastor, a bit overwhelmed at the possibilities in front of me, and with admiration for what having a church with a mission like ours means to the community.

About a year after I started at St. Peter's, I was with a gathering of friends and someone asked the kids at the event what their parents did for work, curious what they might say. When it was my kids' turn I was caught off-guard. I didn't know what they would say. Being a marketer or fundraiser isn't as easy to comprehend as many professions. I thought they would say "he talks on the phone a lot" or something like that. I was shocked at Molly's response: "My Dad is a pastor." No one had ever said that. What a feeling to realize that others - in this case my daughter, recognized an identity you'd hadn't fully embraced yourself. She saw me become a pastor. And that's all because of you and this amazing community of faith. With amazing teachers like Lori and Becca, I've been able to see myself in that role. In short, you've helped me find me and it will take a lifetime to fully express my gratitude.

I hope we've learned some things from each other. You've shown me what it means to be a Christian community that shows genuine love and care for one another and you've shown me how hard a church must work to live up to the standards it sets for itself and the standards God expects of us.

I hope, among other things, that I've helped illustrate the importance of engaging matters of faith in the public square and helped you see the power a church like St. Peter's has in helping members of the LGBTQ community heal from past religious trauma.

I look forward to cherishing our last few weeks together. Fittingly, at my favorite time of the year. I pray that our paths will cross in ministry together in the church at-large and I pray that St. Peter's continues to be a beacon of hope, peace, joy and love in a world that needs it more and more everyday. Thank you for being exactly what I needed as I step into a career of ministry.



Formative Congregations Grant

The Center for Congregations awarded us (and only a handful of other congregations) a Formative Congregations grant. The grant totals \$50,000, and all of that money must be used within our congregation. Our proposal was bold; there are many opportunities planned for St. Peter's over the course of the next year. We are excited to be offered this opportunity and are hopeful that you'll enjoy the many things that have been made possible by this grant!

December Prayer Station: Take What You Need

As we prepare for Christmas and eagerly anticipate all the season has to offer, we will come together in our prayers and creativity. For the month of December, we will pray with strips of cloth that we will then tie around a hanging Advent wreath. Together, we will add our prayers to the wreath, and each week we will watch the wreath grow. The Advent wreath is a reminder of the hope, peace, joy, and love God promises to birth into the world. Each week we will claim those promises and offer our prayers to God as we work together to make those promises a reality.

Lay Leadership: The Heart of Our Congregation Retreat on January 25

Did you know that the United Church of Christ (our denomination) practices congregational polity? This means that every local congregation is its own highest authority. Thus, it is the CONGREGATION that makes decisions for our church, not a national setting or other constituency. In our context, this means that we have a congregational meeting to vote on things like our budget and officers. Our LAY LEADERS do the work of our congregation, and these leaders are amazing.

Every year, our Leadership Team (members of the Governance, Finance & Operations, and Ministry Councils) gets together for a retreat prior to the kickoff of our program year. This year, we are doing things a little bit differently. Our Leadership Team will have a retreat on January 25 at ArtMix in Indianapolis (www.artmixindiana.org) with representatives from Fearless Dia-

logue .fearlessdialogues.com). There will be about 30 leaders gathered to enjoy a creative and spirit -filled experiences. Please pray for our leaders... and thank you!

One Service and Fearless Dialogues Congregational Experience on

Mark your calendars now for Sunday, March 15, 2020! Our Formative Congregations Grant is offering us a unique opportunity. We are bringing animators from Fearless Dialogues (www.fearlessdialogues.com) to our congregation for a special experience on Sunday, March 15, 2020. Worship will be different on that day. We are still working out the details, but for now, know that we will all be together, and we will be nurturing our faith in new ways on that morning. Our leadership will experience a version of Fearless Dialogues in January, and then a few weeks later, the opportunity will be offered to the entire congregation. We are VERY excited about this spirit-filled, creative, and challenging offering; please pray us through the development process and plan to attend!

Update on Fall Focus Groups for the Congregation

The fall season Focus Groups have been facilitated and we'd like to provide a short update. Thank you to everyone from the community who donated some of their time to come and share their perspectives. It was a wonderful opportunity to hear from many people about important questions related to St. Peter's. Four Focus Groups occurred, three on Sundays between services and one on a weekday evening. Overall, 46 members of the church participated, representing a wide range of experience and involvements.

- In round numbers, roughly a third of participants have been part of St. Peter's for 5 years or less, roughly a third have been active between 15-5 years, and roughly a third have been active longer than 15 years.
- The three key themes of the structured conversations were:
 - a. St. Peter's' identity and core values,
 - b. our impact beyond these walls in the wider community and world,
 - c. and how to reconcile our values and impact with the reality of limited resources.

We received a great deal of constructive input that was recorded by members of the Generosity Team in full. A report of major themes is being drafted and will be sent to Governance in the final week of November. Members of the Generosity Team and Staff Support are still reflecting on the wider learning we are seeing from the Focus Groups.

The report is not meant to represent any kind of final word or conclusion, but quite the opposite. We hope it is a starting point for further intentional discussion and listening. Naturally, the report will not capture every comment shared in the Focus Groups nor did we get a chance to hear all the ideas to be found in the community. To that end, we hope St. Peter's members will mark their calendars for January 5th, which will have the first of more regular Congregational Conversations, where the full community will gather for one service followed by the opportunity for the chance to break bread together for lunch and engage in further discussion, input, and sharing related to the work of the Generosity Team.

Thank you to those who shared guidance and assisted in this process and I share much appreciation for everyone who has shared their perspective in any way during this season of listening.

Congregational Conversations

In the many shared perspectives, ideas, and experiences; a desire to continue the conversation continued to surface. As Daniel named, it's clear that these Focus Groups were just the beginning of further conversation and reflection. An idea emerged from several of the Focus Groups and individuals to address this desire. Congregational Conversations: A setting and time like a Town Hall, but a little more informal, not time restricted, and involving food seemed wise. As was named above, the Congregational Conversations will be quarterly (every three-ish months) on a Sunday. On these Sundays we will have one service followed by the Congregational Conversation with a light lunch. During these conversations we will share further insights and ideas pertaining to the business of the church and the Generosity Team.

The hope behind these Congregational Conversations is that we'll have plenty of time for discussion, there will be time to digest and process information and conversation, and we know that the conversation will be able to continue at the next gathering.

We are hopeful that this will be one way in which to deepen and broaden our conversation as a community as our congregation continues to grow and evolve. Please join us at our first Congregational Conversation on January 5th. Combined worship will be held at 10:00am with the conversation and lunch to follow.

Sanctuary Lights and Carpet Update



While the pews were pulled out, we had a couple of areas repaired and the carpet in the Sanctuary cleaned. **Thank you for all who helped.**









Social Media Team is Launched!



Donating Stock or Mutual Fund Shares at St. Peter's

Thank you for generously supporting the mission of St. Peter's United Church of Christ! Donating stock or mutual fund shares to the church is a wonderful way to experience both the joy of giving AND significant tax advantages. The tax advantages may include:

- * NO CAPITAL GAINS TAX payable either by you or by the church
- * NO GIFT OR ESTATE TAX because SPUCC is a charitable organization
- * AN INCOME TAX DEDUCTION based on the present value of the gift

You may find numerous examples of just how powerful this method of giving is by searching online for "donating appreciated stock tax benefits".

An important determination in deciding how to best gift your shares is whether they have increased or decreased in value. If your shares have increased in value they should be "donated" to the church, NOT "redeemed" or "sold" or "cashed-in". If your shares have decreased in value, it's better to sell the shares first and then give the proceeds to the church by personal or brokerage firm check so you may deduct the loss on your taxes.

St Peter's has an account with Merrill Lynch Wealth Management who will help facilitate you in the gifting process.
