### **Restroom Remodel Update**

The "Restroom Evolution" team has been discussing and planning a potential restroom remodel and has some exciting news to share for the upcoming year. The restrooms in question are the "Front-of House" restrooms across from the Sanctuary between the Office Manager's office and Pastors' office. Understanding that the existing restrooms are outdated and seeking to live out our Covenant of Welcome, the team sought to create a space that has the following characteristics:

- Gender neutral
- More bathrooms
- Accessible
- Family Friendly
- Chip away at the plumbing renovation problem

The plans on the next page show the existing "Front-of House " men's and women's restroom being replaced with communal water closets (individual toilets in walled compartments with standard doors and privacy locks), communal sink area, and a private accessible, family restroom. The current design adds two additional toilets and would be gender neutral. Note that the "Back of House" restrooms, between the Music Room and Youth Room will be unchanged and remain as currently configured.

A contractor provided a preliminary estimate and the Restroom Evolution Team worked with Finance & Operations Council and Governance Council to establish a budget of \$50,000 for the project. This will allow for additional design tweaks and construction contingency. Governance Council and Finance & Operations plan to raise the money through donations.

The process moving forward is to finalize drawings to get competitive bids (the goal being 3 bids) in April. The project and bids will be presented for discussion at the May 3<sup>rd</sup> Congregational Conversation and again at the May 28<sup>th</sup> Town Hall. The hope is to have a vote at the Annual Congregational Meeting on June 14<sup>th</sup> and start construction, assuming approval, by the end of July, after our next Family Promise hosting dates and while our preschool is out of session. This timeline would allow for construction to be completed before the beginning of September when the preschool begins their school year.

I would like to thank the other Restroom Evolution members (Seth Kreigh, Rick Searcy, Greg McMullen), Finance & Operations and Governance Council for their continued support and enthusiasm for this project. This process has allowed me to experience "Being the Church" both figuratively and literally. ## Lent 2020

#### **March Study with Lori** "Easter for Progressive Christians" 5 Tuesdays in March 1:30-2:30p.m.

Come prepare for Easter 2020 in a new way... delve deeper, explore more, and do it with other people who are asking questions of their faith as well! Using the book "Easter for Progressive Christians" by Donald Schmidt, we will explore each of the Easter narratives. Each week is meant to stand alone, so come to as many sessions as you'd like! Books are available in the church office. PLEASE SIGN up in REALM or in FELLOWSHIP HALL so that we can keep enough books on hand and choose the appropriate space for our gatherings.

From the book: "So what really happened that first Easter Sunday? The simple answer is that no one knows... [and that is] only a problem if one is trying to prove that each of the stories is factually accurate. If we suspend that attempt for a moment and read the Easter stories in the gospels for what they are – profound statements of faith – we may discover something much more powerful and lasting..."



#### Midweek Contemplative Services with Becca 4 Wednesdays in March 7:00-8:00p.m.



After such positive experiences from last year's contemplative services, we will be offering them again during the month of March. Becca will be leading a contemplative worship service on Wednesday evenings at 7:00pm. Worship will be designed to be soft and provoking, pensive and engaging. We will sing and/or listen to music. We will pray and engage in a spiritual practice. We will celebrate Communion. This is designed to be a contemplative space to be attentive and present to each other and the Spirit. Join us on Wednesdays at 7:00: March 4, 11, 18 & 24.

#### Art Wall Display Stations of the Cross

The art wall display during the Lent and Easter seasons is an installation of the Stations of the Cross. It features artwork from our members telling the story of Christ's condemnation to his entombment. It is traditional to visit and pray or meditate at each station to submerge into Christ's story. Each of our artists has their own unique take on the stations, and we encourage you to engage with each piece in thought. Also there are coloring pages below each station, take one to color and we will display them in Fellowship Hall.

Who are we becoming in these days prior to the joy of Easter? Some are bold enough to say, "You can't really experience the joy of Easter without the challenge of Maundy Thursday." If you've never attended a Maundy Thursday service, please consider coming this year. It'll set the stage for the power of Easter and will likely give you plenty to think about prior to Sunday morning's celebration of the Resurrection! Childcare will be provided.

### Easter Sunrise Service April 12 at 6:45 a.m.

Sunrise services on Easter morning have been going on for generations. We have held this tradition at St. Peter's for many years, and it will continue this year! #### **From Lori**

This is what I looked at all day today. A candle holder given to me by Becca because I love trees *and* candles, and a sticker with Jesus offering me the bread of life and reminding me that I am loved. I am SO grateful for today. This candle and sticker sum it all up for me: There is light in this world... always – AND – We are growing deep, spiritual roots and broad, theological branches... always – AND – I am loved... always. It seems so simple, and yet...

All day, I continued to mull over the advice given to me by Miroslav Volf at a retreat with the Wabash Pastoral Leadership Program. He referenced the words of Dante: "Long for what you have." So I thought about what I have, and I was almost moved to tears. What I have is a faith commu-

nity that actually *does* what it *says* it believes. And I LONG for just that. How do I know that this community is something special? Well there are about 1001 reasons, but this has been my day:

- A conversation with a representative from The UCC's Cornerstone Fund about congregational and personal financial investments
- Giving insight into our labyrinth to a person from a neighboring community who wants to bring a group of high school girls over to experience the power of the labyrinth
- A conversation with 20 of our preschoolers about homelessness and mirrors and the way that God is reflected in all of us
- At least 20 email responses... or maybe it was 30... or 40
- An exchange with a Jewish friend about our congregation's support of them and the importance of interfaith relationships in today's society.
- A dialogue with another person about our bathroom remodel at St. Peter's.
- Sharing questions with Christian Theological Seminary about a future student
- Congratulating a family on a new baby
- Supporting at least four people through medical wildernesses
- Connecting with a colleague in another town who is wrestling with the need to change worship times
- Offering compassion to a colleague who serves in an unsupportive work environment
- Researching doxologies with our music staff
- Preparing two bulletins, a newsletter, announcements for our weekly email, and some prayers
- Finalizing generosity letters with our Generosity Team Leader and our Office Administrator
- Reading the scripture for next Sunday and resting in its goodness
- Gathering resources for Lenten worship
- Trying to schedule time with someone who feels the hurt from a LGBTQ+ suicide
- Talking with a person who identifies as trans about a friend who was forced to enter conversion therapy by their congregation and offering an alternative path

This is not an exhaustive list, and the day is not over. I don't even want it to be. This is good work, St. Peter's. The work that I get to do is amazing... I am humbled to journey with you in the myriad ways that are called "being church." I hope that you can light a candle sometime soon, hear the words of The

Sacred say to you, "You Are Loved," and then get to work engaging your faith in new ways. This Lent, we are journeying into the wilderness together, and while some people describe the wilderness as scary, unpredictable, and dangerous, I like to think of the wilderness as full of possibility, energizing, and surprising. The same could be said of ministry. True Story. See you Sunday, if not before! - LB

#### **From Becca**

I vacuumed underneath my couch this week. That feels both like a confession and a piece of mundane information. It feels like a confession, because really given the state of it, I should have vacuumed underneath my couch long before this week. And I could have just kept that to myself and let you think I vacuum underneath my couch regularly. But Lent feels like an invitation to vacuum underneath our spiritual couches.

I look forward to Lent every year for that reason. It feels like spring cleaning. It feels like a detox. It feels like all the little dust bunnies are finally being cleaned up.

I'm not completely sure as to why, but Lent feels special in this way. I feel more committed and more attentive than I do the rest of the year. These six weeks are the invitation I actually accept and look forward to attending. It is a time to re-evaluate my connection to God and to make the necessary adjustments for that connection to be streaming clearly.

Lent looks and feels differently for each of us. Here is what I hope for each of us this season: Accept the invitation. Be intentional. Engage this time with God in some way. Stay present to the stories of Jesus' ministry. Observe and see what happens. And then share that goodness with others; don't keep it to yourself.

For those who like a good theme: we'll be exploring the season of Lent through the theme of wilderness. Many of us have experienced a form of wilderness at some point in our lives. I like the imagery of wilderness, which in its many forms, are all spacious in some way. The ocean, the desert, the plains...all feel expansive. Let us see what the Spirit is offering us in this season of expanding and intentionality. Perhaps it's as simple as decluttering and removing the dust bunnies. - BL

### **Carmel UMC Food Pantry**

### Family Promise (FP) Hosting March 1 · 8

FP is a not-for-profit organization that helps FAMILIES experiencing homelessness. FP runs two rotations, 14 people each, each week throughout the year. During the day their home base is the FP Day Center. While there, adults get help finding permanent housing, searching for jobs (if they are not already employed) & navigating additional services that are available to them. School age children head off to school/camp from the Day Center. In the evenings, each rotation of guests is welcomed at one of the many congregations in the FP network. St Peter's is one of those congregations. St Peter's typically hosts FP guests four weeks throughout the year.

### **One Great Hour of Sharing**

One Great Hour of Sharing is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that carries God's message of love and hope to people in crisis. The UCC works with international partners to provide sources of clean water, food, education and health care, small business micro-credit, advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons, and emergency relief and rehabilitation. #### Donating Stock or Mutual Fund Shares at St. Peter's

Thank you for generously supporting the mission of St. Peter's United Church of Christ! Donating stock or mutual fund shares to the church is a wonderful way to experience both the joy of giving AND significant tax advantages. The tax advantages may include:

- \* NO CAPITAL GAINS TAX payable either by you or by the church
- \* NO GIFT OR ESTATE TAX because SPUCC is a charitable organization
- \* AN INCOME TAX DEDUCTION based on the present value of the gift

You may find numerous examples of just how powerful this method of giving is by searching online for "donating appreciated stock tax benefits".

An important determination in deciding how to best gift your shares is whether they have increased or decreased in value. If your shares have increased in value they should be "donated" to the church, NOT "redeemed" or "sold" or "cashed-in". If your shares have decreased in value, it's better to sell the shares first and then give the proceeds to the church by personal or brokerage firm check so you may deduct the loss on your taxes.

St Peter's has an account with Merrill Lynch Wealth Management who will help facilitate you in the gifting process.
